**NEWA WRESTLERS OF THE WEEK:** Senior 125 pounder **Anthony Nicolichia** of Roger Williams University and junior 133 pounder **Steven Valastro** of the University of Southern Maine share the “*Wrestler of the Week*,” honors. Nicolichia finished second in the Ithaca College Invitational Tournament, posting a 4-1 record in the event. He dropped a 5-0 decision to nationally 8<sup>th</sup> ranked Mike McNally of RIT in the title match. Valastro also took second at Ithaca, dropping a decision to nationally #8 ranked Ray Sarinelli of TCNJ in the finals. In the semifinals he knocked off nationally #6 ranked Justin Seifried of Ithaca 6-0.

**NEWA ROOKIE WRESTLERS OF THE WEEK:** Freshman 197 pounder **Nick Cambi** of Roger Williams University and freshman 285 pounder **Sean DeDeyn** of Johnson & Wales University share the “*Rookie Wrestler of the Week*,” honors. Cambi finished second in the Ithaca Invite, becoming the first freshman in RWU history to place in the event. DeDeyn posted a 7-1 record and took third place after winning six matches in a row.
